Participant Biographies

ASHLEY BENNINGHOFF

Training: Fort Wayne Ballet, Southern Methodist University (BFA), Dance Space Ashley began her dance training at the Fort Wayne Ballet under the direction of Michael Tevlin continuing through Karen Gibbons-Brown. There she danced lead roles in Les Sylphides, Paquita, Sean Curran's A Soldier's Tale, and The Nutcracker, as well as works choreographed by Radmila Teodorovic Novosel and Karen Gibbons-Brown. Ashley attended a number of summer workshops including: Joffrey Midwest, Boston Ballet, and Dance Space in New York City where she performed in a piece by Alexandra Beller. She then went to school at Southern Methodist University where she graduated with a Bachelor's in Dance Performance in 2005. While there she discovered and fell in love with modern dance and performed in works by Martha Graham, Robert Battle, Max Stone, and Sabrina Madison-Cannon. She also choreographed a number of pieces for the bi-annual student choreographed Brown Bag production. Ashley choreographed, organized, and danced in a full dance program entitled Sides, which was met with rave reviews.
